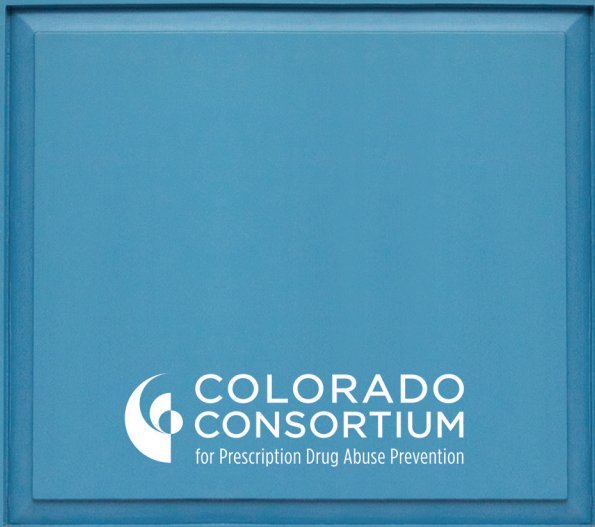

If you or a loved one use prescription pain medicine that contains opioids, you are at risk of an overdose. Most fatal overdoses happen accidentally at home and can affect anyone, regardless of their background and whether or not they have a substance use disorder. Having naloxone in your medicine cabinet or wherever you keep medication ensures you are ready and able to stop an overdose and save a life.

## WHAT IS NALOXONE?

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Naloxone is an FDA-approved medication that reverses opioid overdoses. It is trusted by doctors, first responders, and emergency medical professionals and has saved thousands of lives.

It is available at many pharmacies across the state without a doctor's prescription.

In fact, it's available at 500+ pharmacies and counting. Talk to your pharmacist about the benefits of bringing naloxone home.
